(i.e. three prong electrical plugs) and in proper working order before using. Strictly follow all manufactures precautions and recommendations. <b>DO NOT</b> overload circuits by stringing multiple power strips (also known as daisy chaining)				
2	Using ladders or step-ladders	甲	Ladder collapsing; Slipping and falling from ladder	Pie Pie Pie Pie	Inspect ladder before use. Use ladder at proper height. Make sure the ladder in assembled, locked and on level ground. DO NOT exceed weight limit for ladder. DO NOT stand on the top or top rung of ladder and make sure a co-worker is holding ladder if any higher than a step-ladder.
