II. Update on Proposal to President Cropper

The proposal has been created; VP Franz Lozano should deliver it to President Cropper tomorrow. The President is eager for us to use Lot 'O' (motel). Roseann is working with Risk Management, Facilities and Otto Construction to clean up Lot 'O' and add fencing. Facilities rented two light stands to use at tonight's game.

New Business:

I. Welcome New Members – Marc McGee (Academic Affairs) and Matt Saxton (ASCMA)

Marc McGee is the Director for Admissions. Matt is the Financial Vice President for ASCMA. The committee welcomed both members on board.

II. Parking Fines (Increase)

Over the years, increased demands on parking – such as the hiring of new faculty and staff, the elimination of parking spaces due to the construction of the new Dining Center, and the continued disbursement and use of student parking endorsements – have reduced parking space availability, especially in Lots 'A' (Administration) and 'D' (Waterfront). Due to fewer parking space openings, frustrated permit holders have suggested that if fines were higher, then fewer persons would park illegally in these lots.

The last time fees were raised was in 2008; at that time, the base rate (for a basic citation) of \$16 doubled to \$32. To deter violation occurrences, it is important to determine appropriate rate

increases for basic violations as well as safety violations so that the fine matches the violation. To help with fine increase decisions, a spreadsheet¹ was started to explain how our parking fines compare to other CSU campuses. The committee reviewed the spreadsheet and asked questions.

To allow for more research and further discussion, Marc put forth the motion to table a vote on parking fine increases to the next meeting.

Roger seconded the motion. The motion carried. (Yes: 6; No: 0)
