New 2004 Cruise Health Standard

Due to the special nature of the educational experience, which includes working on the Training Ship Golden Bear (TSGB), often including international travel, the following cruise health standard of the California Maritime Academy is established to determine the ability of all licensed officers, faculty and staff to perform their duties without posing a risk to themselves, others, or to the ship.

Employees who are prescribed and/or currently engaging in the use of controlled substances, psychotropics, or any medications that may impair their ability to perform their duties, must provide this information to the Academy at the time of their pre-cruise physical examination. In addition, drugs of this type newly prescribed and/or taken once the vessel is underway must be reported to the Commanding Officer by the Medical Officer with advice as to the individual's ability to function safely and in compliance with the law. At any time the Commanding Officer becomes ill/injured and is prescribed a controlled substance or a medication that may impair judgment or performance, this information is required to be provided to the Director of the Health Center for evaluation by the appropriate academy administrator.

Failure to disclose or report this information may result in disciplinary action.

Purpose: To reduce risk and create a safe environment for all crewmembers onboard the TSGB. Temporary removal of employees in safety sensitive positions until medically cleared for return-to-duty.
