## Summer Cruise Changed Due to Clearance Problems in New Zealand



The Office of Marine Program reports that once again, the New Zealand Government is not allowing the USA to send government owned vessels to New Zealand unless the US government will assure New Zealand that the vessel does not have nuclear weapons or propulsion. The US government has a policy not to confirm not deny. During our last visit, New Zealand had modified this rule, but now it is back and we have been denied clearance.
