VPN Access How to Connect to the Campus Network From a Mac

- 1. Go to https://cmavpn.csum.edu
 - a. Enter your username and password (the same ones that that you use to logon to your campus email from off campus).
 - b. Make sure that the Realm is CMA-maritime.
 - c. Click the Sign In button.
- 2. Upon successfully logging into the VPN, you should see Network Connect near the bottom of the window as depicted below.



3. If you receive a popup that asks if you "want to accept this certificate from the website "cmavpn.csum.edu", as depicted below, click the Trust button.



4. Upon successfully connecting the Cal Maritime's network, the following popup will be displayed.



5. At this point, your Mac computer has an encrypted connection (called a tunnel) to Cal Maritime's network. It is the same as if you were on campus and your computer was connected to the network. If you have Entourage or another other email application that is already configured for use when you are in your office on campus, it should work for you now while you are connected through the VPN from off campus.

Controlling a Computer from Off Campus


Note: Before attempting to control a computer that is connected to Cal Maritime's network and running, you will need to know your computers IP address (which can change each time that computer is rebooted) or its assigned network name. If you need assistance in obtaining this information, please contact the Help Desk.

Note: The following instructions are for controlling a Windows XP machine on campus using a Macbook Air from off campus.

- 6. You must be connected to the network through the VPN as described in the section above.
- 7. Launch Remote Desktop Connection on the Mac. You can search for it using SpotLight. Remote desktop may not be available unless purchased on older version of Macs.



- 8. In the text box for the Remote Desktop Connection, type the IP address or name of the computer you want to control.
- 9. Click the Connect button
- 10. Next, the computer on campus that you are trying to control will challenge you for your campus network credentials. A popup similar to the one depicted below will appear.



- 11. Enter your campus network username and password. These are the same credentials that you use to logon to email from off campus.
- 12. A remote terminal session to the desktop computer on campus is now established.
