## Call to Order

- Senators Isakson and Simons will be posting some information on update from BoT plenary


## Vice Chair's Report

- Elections
- All unopposed
- Watch for upcoming official elections, as required by bylaws
- CommUNITY Day
- President does not want classes canceled, so there has been an effort to run sessions relevant to the class to serve an "in lieu of class" option NOT canceling
- Sponsored by Community Engagement this year
- Many community partners committed
- Many faculty are inviting guests into classes
- Cal-GETC resolution bumped to next meeting


## Second Reading Faculty Development Committee Bylaws

- Senator Setniker presenting
- Largest changes:
- Membership is currently every department chair plus 2 at-large and we struggle to get everyone in a meeting - changing to three members plus Director of Faculty Development
- Senator Luce share department question concerning Director of Faculty Development serving as an elected member versus an ex officio member
- Senator Nordenholz asked about election process - is it faculty-wide? Is it other?
- Chair McNie elects to table until we can look into Senate election process


## Second Reading Professional Leave Committee Bylaws

- Senator Luce presenting
- Worked on election structures, to allow for different school structures
- One from each department, but each department does not have to send a representative
- "Those who want representation, get it"
- At least three members for a quorum
- Senator Simons motions to approve resolution, Senator Senk seconds. 18 for, 0 against, 0 abstentions. Motion carries.


## Second Reading Judicial Committee Bylaws

- Senator Simons presenting
- Three membership to minimize workload
- Worked on clarity of how members are defined, involving exhausting each category in favor of institutional knowledge
- Efforts to respect confidentiality
- Senator Burback motions to approve resolution, Senator Setniker seconds. 18 for, 0 against, 0 abstentions. Motion carries.


## First Reading - Resolution on MT Faculty Salary

- Senator Burback presenting
- MT Department has voted in favor of this resolution before passing to senate-wide
- Asking for:
- comprehensive review of the compensation structure, aiming for parity
- Collaborative development
- Invoke CBA Article 31.12
- Market Increase Requests
- Ongoing Dialogue
- Priority to Equitable Compenstion
- Equitable Initial Salaries
- License Valuation
- Senator Burback advocates for no divisiveness, but to be heard
- Shares data that shows MT TT Faculty consistently the lowest paid
- Senator Satterwhite would like to see the data again, echoes issues in ET department


## Policy 528 Changes

- Senator Simons presenting
- Last updated Policy 528 in 2009
- Purpose of revision is to address some equity concerns with part-time lecturers
- Departmental committee is currently not included in the evaluation of these lecturers
- New proposal is for departments to take ownership - to vote on whether peer review committee or department chair shall be evaluation designee

- Advancement oversees alumni relations, yacht donation program, development, special events, advancement services, foundation
- Leading the Way Campaign was successful and hope to run another
- Foundation contributions for 22-23:
- 1.06 million to campus wide needs (athletics travel, commencement, sim upgrades)
- 1.9 million for classroom tech
- 575,938 ed scholarships
- 100,000 for offshore sailing
- 501,000 furnishing Mayo
- 23-24 fundraising goal for 4.8 million
- Departmental staff restructure
- Rethinking and reimagining events
- Revisiting and clarifying policies and campus trust funds
- Database Clean-Up and Updates
- Continue to work with alumni on campus needs
- Continue to work with admin, faculty and staff on campus needs

- New $1^{\text {st }}$ Assistant Engineer
- Any issues on board: email C/E and 1 AE at same time

- Continue to increase habitability (new beds, tile, piping)
