Random COVID testing continues. The next round will be tomorrow, Thursday 03/25, and emails went out for those selected. They are testing in Rizza Lobby between 1000 and 1400. **You should continue testing whether vaccinated or not.**

If you have been vaccinated outside of the campus event, we still encourage and appreciate it if you let us know. Students/cadets send information to studenthealth@csum.edu and employees to covid19hs@csum.edu. All information is confidential.

In addition, Solano County has recently opened up vaccination opportunities for “workers in education.” These definitions are inclusive, so there is an opportunity for any student, staff, or faculty member to try to sign up. Isolation separates sick people with a contagious disease from people who are not sick.

Quarantine separates and restricts the movement of people who were exposed to a contagious disease to see if they become sick. In the second column is the # COVID tests administered, and that came back negative in green with positives in red.
