TRAINING SHIP GOLDEN BEAR (TSGB)

The Training Ship *Golden Bear* (TSGB) serves as the primary training platform on which cadets apply technological skills introduced in the classroom. Each summer, cadets in their first and third years depart with licensed faculty officers for two months during the annual Training Cruise. All students, whether in the license programs or not, can interact with other cultures and learn about the peoples who are their hosts. They can also experience connections to the larger world and develop an understanding of how their selected vocations will function in the context of an international setting.

NATURAL BEAUTY

Located on a compact but scenic waterfront campus in Vallejo, California, California State University Maritime Academy (Cal Maritime) is a unique and specialized campus of the 23-campus California State University system. Serving 1200 students, we are one of only seven degree-granting maritime academies in the United States and the only one on the West Coast.

ATHLETICS

The CSU Maritime Academy sponsors fourteen intercollegiate athletic teams, including seven - men's and women's basketball, men's and women's soccer, men's and women's cross country and men's golf - that are members of the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics and the California Pacific Conference. There are also seven intercollegiate club teams participating in men's and women's water polo, dinghy and offshore sailing, men's and women's crew, and rugby. Building teams and developing leaders have long been recognized as a critical element for successful athletic competition. Students can also participate in a variety of intramural sports and recreational activities. The Physical Education and Aquatics Center offers classes, work-out facilities, and an Olympic class pool. Bodnar field features a synthetic turf field for soccer and rugby and a two lane jogging track.

EDWARDS LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM (ELDP)

Learn Together. Grow Together. Go Together.

The Edwards Leadership Development Program (ELDP), funded in part by a generous gift of the Tom and Libby Edwards Family, provides a distinct, palpable leadership advantage in combination with a world-class education. Starting Fall 2019, ELDP will consist of three areas:

- *The Edwards Leadership Seminar Series: A cohort-based, foundational leadership experience that serves as a catalyst for learning and leading in the global maritime environment.
- *Peer Coaching: A cohort-based, skill-building workshop that allows cadets to deepen their knowledge of leadership principles by helping fellow cadets apply their learning and recognize their development
- *Partners and Events: This will allow allows cadets to apply new knowledge in off-campus settings, explore different points of view, and work with other educators and leaders.

FOOD SECURITY & UNIFORM LOCKER - CHANGE NAME

Cal Maritime's Food Security program provides food vouchers for meals at the Dining Center to students in need. These vouchers are donated by cadets from their meal plans or from generous monetary donations made by faculty, staff, parents of current students and alumni. Additionally, our campus food pantry dispenses emergency food to members of the campus community who endure food insecurity and food hardship. The program works to to help them meet their dietary needs.

We also maintain a Cal Maritime Uniform Locker. Students have the opportunity to donate their gently worn uniform items to the closet for their classmates to utilize when they are in need of newer uniform shirt, pants, jacket, collar device and other uniform items. This effort is managed by student leaders at no cost to the students.



CAL MARITIME LINGO

Academic Advisor - a faculty member who helps students develop an academic plan toward graduation

Academic Probation - Students are placed in this standing when earning below a 2.0 Cumulative, Campus, Major, and/or two out of three term GPA

Administrative Academic Probation - Students are placed in this standing when they have repeated or need to repeat more than 16 units

GE - General Education

GPA - Grade Point Average (calculated by dividing grade points earned by the number of credits attempted)

Hold - A penalty placed on student's account preventing him from registering

Priority Registration - ability to register for courses prior to regular registration period begins

Add/Drop Period - window of time at the beginning of a semester when students can add or drop a class without any penalties

TRIAD

6-bar student leadership team (Student Hall Director, AS Executive President & Corps Commander) focusing on different aspects of student life fostering a holistic college experience for the corps of cadets.

RESIDENTIAL HALL OFFICERS

Employment opportunity for students to be leaders in their residential communities, making a difference in the lives of the students they serve.

ASCMA OFFICERS

Officers of the Associated Students of California Maritime Academy. Student Government body focusing on peer needs.

CORPS OFFICERS

Leaders at different levels of Corps of Cadets who provide support, guidance, and coaching in the various responsibilities associated with being a cadet (i.e. Formation, watch, etc)



CAL MARITIME LINGO

Britespace - Cal Maritime has switched to a new learning management system (LMS). An LMS is web-based software that helps instructors develop and organize learning materials, offer exams or quizzes, and allow students to track their learning and grades. Our new system is [Brightspace](#)

Roadmaps - an outline of students' four year course plan. Due to prerequisites, co-requisites, and the limited number of certain course offerings, students are directed to follow their roadmap when registering for courses. Many courses are offered only once a year, and even if a course is offered more than once a year the course may be reserved for a specific cohort

FAQs

What is FERPA and how can a parent gain access to necessary student information?

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (FERPA) protects the privacy of student educational records. Once a student enters college, the rights of access to the student's records transfer to the student. This means that all academic information regarding your college student goes directly to the student unless the student has given specific, written permission to release that information to someone else. Students may choose to grant California State University Maritime Academy permission to share protected information, including financial, academic, and disciplinary information, with you, by completing the Authorization to Release Student Information on the Registrar's Office website. Without your student's signed form on file, campus personnel are not authorized to share educational records with parents or guardians.

ENTERPRISE SERVICES

Enterprise Services in the Division of Administration and Finance provides leadership and operational oversight of the Residence Halls, Dining Center, The Bistro and Keelhauler Café, the Keelhauler Shops, Conference and Events, and the Cal Maritime Portpass. The departments within Enterprise Services create an array of core services and amenities in support of campus life.

Flex Dollars: Flex Dollars are similar to a debit account and are good for the academic year in which they are purchased. Use your Flex Dollars at any location on campus. Unused Flex Dollars from fall semester will roll over to spring semester, but will expire at the end of the academic year.
